Cultural Treasures Amidst the Vineyards

"Where there is no wine, there is no love."
- Euripides

According to Euripides, then, the region known as the Cape Winelands is brimming over with love. Certainly, love can be seen in the tender care bestowed upon the budding vines during the growing season, and in the gentle hands that pick the plump bunches in the harvest season. There is a saying among viniculturists: if you don't take care of the vine, then no-one will care for the wine. Certainly, in the Cape Winelands, the lush and plentiful vines speak of modern science and old-fashioned love-of-the-vine coming together in equal measure to produce superb wine.

After the harvest, comes the crushing and pressing of grapes, fermentation, clarification, and then aging and bottling – all stages that occur under the watchful and tender care of the winemakers. Winemaking has been described as a craft that combines science, art and intuition. Since every wine is unique, there is no single recipe for producing a great wine, but the common ingredient found in most great wines is love – the love of the winemaker for his or her craft, the alchemy that turns grape juice into wine. In short, in the Cape Winelands, winemakers are driven by their love of wine.

This legacy of love can be traced back as far as 1655 when Jan van Riebeeck of the Dutch East India Company (VOC), together with his chief gardeners, planted the first vines in the Company's Garden. Four years later, van Riebeeck captured a historic moment in his diary on 2 February 1659: "Today, praise be to God, wine was made for the first time, from Cape grapes." This marked the birth of South African wine, and that single vineyard has grown far beyond the Cape Peninsula. The Cape Winelands now embraces the three towns of Stellenbosch, Franschhoek and Paarl, and most of the surrounding areas as well.

Love of wine is well documented throughout the ages, especially among writers and the literati. Robert Louis Stevenson described wine as "bottled poetry" and Ernest Hemingway admitted "my only regret in life is that I didn't drink more wine." British poet, Lord Byron, had this to say: "Wine cheers the sad, revives the old, inspires the young, and makes weariness forget his toil." But perhaps this tongue-in-cheek quote by an anonymous lover of wine says it best: "Ask not what wine has done for you, but rather what you're willing to do for wine."



1-Anthonij Rupert Wine Estate

Anthonij Rupert Wynne was founded on the farm L'Ormarins in Franschhoek. Originally owned by the late Anthonij Rupert, who passed away in 2001, the farm was taken over by his brother Johann Rupert in 2003. It was Johann Rupert who constructed a state-of-the-art winemaking facility on the estate and the beginnings of what was to become a sprawling enterprise with a focus on terroir-specific wines. Anthonij Rupert Wynne's portfolio of wines includes some of the country's most iconic brands, such as Anthonij Rupert Optima, Protea and L'Ormarins ranges. The company also produces several premium, small-batch wines under the Anthonij Rupert and Cape of Good Hope labels. These wines are known for their complex flavour profiles, refined elegance, and balance, and are prized by wine lovers and collectors around the world.

3-Huguenot Monument

The Huguenot Memorial Museum in Franschhoek recounts the persecution of the Huguenots in France and the settlement of 300 in the Cape. Housed in the reconstructed 18th-century Saasveld building, the museum's exhibitions link Huguenot history with global issues like persecution, exile, and social identity. The site also features the Huguenot Monument, old coachman's house, sundial, and Perfume Museum. A visit to this historic precinct is a must for tourists.

10-Drakenstein Correctional Centre

Drakenstein Correctional Centre (formerly Victor Verster Prison) on the R301 between Paarl and Franschhoek has earned a place in history. It was from here that Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela walked out a free man on Sunday, 11 February 1990, at 16:14 local time, hand-in-hand with his then wife, Winnie Mandela, after spending 27 years behind bars at three different correctional facilities – 18 years on Robben Island, 8 years in Pollsmoor Prison, and finally, 14 months at Drakenstein. Since Drakenstein Correctional Centre is a low-security facility, more of a farm prison, Mandela was not literally behind bars during his stay there. Instead, he lived in a private house inside the prison compound, a house that has now been declared a South African National Heritage Site. Just outside the main gate of the facility stands a larger-than-life statue of the great man himself, with his right fist raised in the Black Power salute. A stirring sight and well worth a visit.



12-Paarl

Paarl Rock, or Paarlberg (Paarl Mountain), rises 542 metres above ground, possibly the world's second or third largest granite outcrop, formed about 500 million years ago. Comprising three interconnected outcrops, it overlooks Paarl with stunning vistas. Trails span 2.5km to 10km, popular for hiking and rock climbing. Dubbed Paarlberg by settler Abraham Gabel for its pear-like shine at dawn. It was sacred to the early Khoisan as Tortoise Mountain.



13-Paarl Bird Sanctuary

This sanctuary is set in 45 hectares of pools and ponds and it's one of Africa's best birding sites for waterfowl. Of course, the diversity of birdlife doesn't stop at waterfowl, so visiting birders can expect to add more than 140 different species to their list, among them, the Protea Canary, Cape Weaver, African Purple Swamphen, Black Drake, Little Bittern, Three-banded Plover, Common Sandpiper, African Jacana, Green-backed Heron, American Purple Gallinule, Greater Painted Snipe, Squacco Heron, Malachite Kingfisher, flamingos, ducks and many more. Incidentally, the collective noun for a gathering of flamingos is a "flamboogie" of flamingos. Isn't it perfect? Visitors can travel along the gravel road at a sedate pace, or stop off at one of the numerous benches and hides along the route. It is a place of sublime peace – a sanctuary for the soul as well as the birds. Entry is free.



15-Paarl Rock

Paarl, named for the Dutch word "Paarl" meaning "pearl", owes its moniker to a settler who likened its gleaming granite peak to a pearl in morning dew. Beyond its geological allure, Paarl is renowned for full-bodied wines like Shiraz, and a rich array of cheeses. Golf enthusiasts also flock here for championship courses at Boschenmeer and Paarl Valley. Whether you're a connoisseur, gourmet, or sports lover, Paarl offers something special for all.

14-Paarl Museum



Its architecture, with gables and a thatched roof, evokes the region's past, offering a captivating journey through Paarl's evolution from colonial settlement to modern wine-making hub, preserving its rich cultural heritage for generations to come.



16-Ridgeback Wines

46-VOC Kruit Huis
The VOC Arsenal, completed on 5 May 1777, is a unique historic building in Stellenbosch. It houses a fascinating collection of 17th-century signalling cannons and other military artefacts. Originally used to store cannons, guns, and ammunition to defend against potential attacks, it still bears the date and VOC (Verenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie) letters on its walls. The VOC Kruithuis is singular in Stellenbosch as the only surviving structure from the East Indian Company era, retaining the VOC badge. Despite its military history, Stellenbosch has remained peaceful, having never heard the sound of gunfire in its 300-year existence. Open Times: at Sam Monday to Friday. 26-Assegaibosch Nature Reserve
This is a small boutique nature reserve, only about 204 hectares in size, and now a World Heritage Site, managed by CapeNature. It lies in the Jonkershoek Valley with the main entrance about 9km from Stellenbosch. It boasts various hiking trails which, at intervals, are closed to the public to allow essential trail maintenance. Phone 087 087 4118 during office hours to ascertain whether the trails are open. The 4.5km Wildflower Walk is one of the more popular walks and is described as moderate. The 9km Stellenbosch hike is obviously tougher. Even when the hiking trails are closed, visitors are welcome to use the very well-maintained picnic and braai area. Please note, however, that alcohol is strictly forbidden here. 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28-Rupert Museum

29-Dorp Street
Before this thoroughfare was called Dorp Street, it was simply referred to as 'the wagon road to the Cape,' which might explain why it is so long. The first thing you notice about Dorp Street is the oak trees that line both sides of the road. Early settlers in Stellenbosch were asked to plant as many oak trees as possible, all over town, so the town became known as Ekikstad (Oak City). The Street exudes an old-world charm, especially in the architecture, which reflects both the Cape Dutch and the Victorian eras. Cape Dutch thatched roofs proudly display 'no smoking' signs while Victorian facades proudly display their brookie lace. Experience Dorp Street up-close to see the harmonious blend of history and modernity, coffee shops and boutiques, museums and galleries.


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
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
40-Stellenbosch Botanical Garden
